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## ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

SPRING 1985

Spring Semester 1985 regular on-campus enrollment at Colorado State University is 17,380 students. This is an increase of 266 students, or 1.6 percent from Spring Semester 1984 when 17,114 students were enrolled. Enrollment in Continuing Education and SURGE courses will be reported at the end of the semester.

This spring men represent 52.5 percent of the regular on-campus enrollment, and women represent 47.5 percent. Last spring men represented 52.4 percent and women 47.6 percent of the enrollment. Compared to Spring 1984, the enrollment of men increased by 173 students or 1.9 percent, and the number of women increased by 93 students or 1.1 percent.

Regular on-campus students represent all 50 states, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and Guam. Enrollment includes sixty-two of the 63 Colorado counties, as well as 87 foreign countries.

This spring 82.0 percent of the students are Colorado residents and 18.0 percent are nonresidents. The percentage of residents increased 1.3 percentage points over the 80.7 percent of Spring 1983.

This spring 86.7 percent of the students are attending full time and 13.3 percent are attending part time. The percentage of full-time students has decreased by 1.5 percentage points since last spring. (The definition of a full-time student is an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits, or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.)
