

ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

SPRING 1986

Spring Semester 1986 regular on-campus enrollment at Colorado State University is 16,541 students. This is a decrease of 839 students, or 4.8 percent from Spring Semester 1985 when 17,380 students were enrolled. Enrollment in Continuing Education and SURGE courses will be reported at the end of the semester.

This spring men represent 52.3 percent of the regular on-campus enrollment, and women represent 47.7 percent. Last spring men represented 52.5 percent and women 47.5 percent of the enrollment. Compared to Spring 1985, the enrollment of men decreased by 478 students or 5.2 percent, and the number of women decreased by 361 students or 4.4 percent.

Regular on-campus students represent all 50 states, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and The Virgin Islands. Enrollment includes sixty-two of the 63 Colorado counties, as well as 83 foreign countries.

This spring 81.7 percent of the students are Colorado residents and 18.3 percent are nonresidents. The percentage of residents decreased 0.3 percentage points from the 82.0 percent of Spring 1985.

[The definition of a full-time student is an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits, or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.]
