The 1986 Summer Session regular on-campus enrollment at Colorado State University is 5762 students. This is an increase of 444 students, or 8.3 percent, from Summer Session 1985 when 5318 students were enrolled.

This summer 49.1 percent of the on-campus enrollment are men and 50.9 percent are women. Last summer men represented 49.8 percent of the enrollment, and women 50.2 percent.

The 5,762 students enrolled represent 48 states and Puerto Rico; 69 foreign countries; and 62 of Colorado's 63 counties. Colorado residents make up 82.7 percent of the on-campus enrollment and nonresidents comprise 17.3 percent. This represents an increase of 0.6 percentage points in Colorado residents over Summer Session 1985.

A greater number of students are taking 9 or more credits than did in Summer Session 1985; the increase being at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. The proportion of students enrolled for 9 or more credits is 19.2 percent. This is an increase from Summer Session 1985, when 17.1 percent of the students took 9 or more credits.
